# Soundscape Cartography

 could gain from those sounds.

How many different bird calls or songs did you hear?  
 Did you hear any other animals, or insects?  
 Did you hear traffic? How far away was it?

Draw a map that describes the landscape  
 based on the sounds you heard. Be as detailed  
 as you can. Include structures, roads, trees, and any  
 thing else that a sound gave you a clue of.

Do you think your soundscape will change over time?  
 How is your soundscape different from other spaces?  
 What could someone sitting here 50 years ago  
 have heard that was the same?  
 What sounds might be different?  
 Does your soundscape tell you anything about  
 the natural habitats in your neighborhood?
